
It seems as they have forgotten where they get their food from. And in some parts of the world, farmers are even harassed and attacked by activists for producing food. In these

Dok Faffa weer op die been

“Wêreld” bid dok Faffa gesond

“Die wêreld het my gesond gebid,” sê dr. Faffa Malan, bekende virtuele veearts en voormalige Landboukundige van die Jaar van Landbouskrywers SA, ná sy wonderbaarlike herstel nadat hy Covid-19 opgedoen het. Kort ná sy ontslag uit die hospitaal en ’n versorgingsplek was hy al weer aan die werk.

Die geliefde Malan is veral bekend vir sy rubriek, *Vra vir Faffa*, op *Landbouweekblad* se webblad, landbou.com, waar hy raad oor dieresiektes gee, en is ’n bekende gesig op die televisieprogram *Landbouweekliks* waar hy ook raad gee en sy bydrae altyd afsluit met: “Lékker boer!”

Toe die nuus breek dat hy vir sy lewe veg, het dit ’n oorweldigende reaksie van boere, mense in landbouverwante beroepe en veeartskringe ontketen. Duisende mense het vir hom gebid. In ’n stadium het lede van die Amerikaanse vereniging vir parasietbeheer vir klein herkouers gebede opgestuur. Plaaslike veeartse wat besig was met voortgesette opleiding, het vir sy herstel gevra. Toe Malan weer op die been kom, was daar meer as 3 000 boodskappe in sy rekenaar. Op sy Facebook-blad het meer as duisend mense boodskappe gelos. Sy selfoon was met stem- en WhatsApp-boodskappe oorlaai. Intussen het Malan se vriende sy aanhangars daagliks op hoogte van sy vordering gehou, waaronder mnr. Willem Kleyn, handelsbemarkingsbestuurder van Elanco-dieregesondheid, die eerste vriend wat Malan besoek het.

Hy en Kleyn het op Donderdag 10 Junie 'n skaapstudiegroep by Winburg toegespreek toe hy siek word. Hy is saam met iemand anders terug na sy woonplek in Pretoria omdat Kleyn nog 'n ander afspraak gehad het. Daar is hy dokter toe en dié het hom aangeraai om die volgende week toetse te laat doen. Sondag het Kleyn en 'n veeartsvriend, dr. Neil Fourie, vir hom gaan kuier.

Daar tref hulle hom op die vloer aan nadat hy met sy kop deur 'n ruit gevallen is. Hy het "soos 'n riet" gebewe. Malan kan egter nie daarvan onthou nie. Op Maandag 14 Junie het hy 'n Covid-19-toets en skandering ondergaan. Hy het agt dae vantevore sy eerste inenting teen die siekte gehad. Die toets was negatief. Hy is in die Life Groenkloof-hospitaal se intensieve sorgeneheid opgeneem en behandel asof hy Covid-19 het. Vanaf 17 Junie was hy op 'n ventilator en onder verdowing. Later het hy positief vir die siekte getoets.

"Ek het die vreeslikste hallusinasies gehad, was aggressief en hulle moes my op die bed vasbind. Ek het 'gesien' daar is 'n luislang in my bed, wat toe deur 'n buurman met 'n tou weggesleep is. Mense het

my bankkaarte kom afvat en al my geld en beleggings onttrek. Twee groepe mense het mekaar aangeval terwyl ek hulpeloos moes toekyk, omdat ek op 'n eiland met drade vasgebind was. Een keer het ek gedink die hospitaal wil vir my gif uit 'n bottel met 'n doodskedel op toedien. Later wou hulle my met mambagif dood maak."

In werklikheid het Malan wonderlike behandeling by die hospitaalpersoneel gekry en het begin herstel. Op 27 Julie is hy na 'n versorgingsplek in Irene oorgeplaas, en ná 'n week is hy ontslaan en het hy by sy dogter, Wilmari, gaan aansterk.

Hy het baie in die hospitaal en versorgingsplek geoefen om sy kragte te herwin. "Kyk hoe doen ek beenopstote. Ek kan aanhou tot jy sê ek moet ophou," en Malan wys hoe maklik hy dit regkry. Hy is nie van plan om nou rustiger te wees nie. Op 76-jarige ouderdom voel hy nog sterk genoeg om sy werk as bestuurder van die Herkouerveterinêre

Vereniging van Suid-Afrika (Ruvasa), voort te sit, Vra vir Fappa op [Landbou.com](#) te hanteer, raad op Landbouweekliks te gee en boeredae toe te spreek.■

"Ek worstel net baie met die vraag oor hoekom ek 'n tweede kans gekry het terwyl van my kennis aan Covid-19 dood is. Daarom dank ek die Vader elke dag. Ek besef nou hoe belangrik dit is om jou huis in orde te kry, vir ingeval. Maak jou saak met die Here reg. Jy weet nie wanneer is dit jou laaste dag op aarde nie."

Supporting smallholder farmers amidst the pandemic

Bayer's "*Better Farms, Better Lives*" initiative in Africa

In line with the company's vision of "health for all, hunger for none", Bayer last year launched the "Better Farms, Better Lives" initiative, a global project which saw the distribution of corn and vegetable seed to help cushion smallholder farmers from the ravages of the pandemic.

In Africa, this distribution exercise has to date been replicated across seven countries including Tanzania, Malawi, Mozambique, Zambia, Zimbabwe, South Africa, and Kenya.

Nozizwe Mhlongo is one of the estimated two million smallholder and subsistence farmers in South Africa, many of whom have been impacted by the effects of Covid-19 and lockdown regulations. She farms on 10 ha of land in Sehlakoane, a rural area in Limpopo, and uses some of this land for maize production, which recently benefited from Bayer's "*Better Farms, Better Lives*" initiative.

Nozizwe was one of the many South African smallholder farmers



who received 2 kg of hybrid maize seeds. This gift has now yielded over 1 350 kg of maize.

"We at Bayer quickly realised that we didn't want a health crisis to become a hunger crisis. We needed to decide how to best support smallholder farmers from low- to middle-income countries across Asia-Pacific, Africa, and Latin America," says Klaus Eckstein, CEO of Bayer South Africa.

"This initiative was started to provide inputs in terms of seeds and crop protection products free of charge to smallholder farmers across these geographies in order to help them to produce sustainable and healthy crops, and to start addressing the impact that Covid-19 has had in these countries.

"At Grain SA, we appreciate the significant contribution that small-scale farming has on household food security and income and realise the damaging impact that the pandemic has had. We have worked closely with Bayer Crop Science and with our farmers to assist as many as possible with this support through the "*Better Farms, Better Lives*" initiative," says Jerry Mthombothi, provincial coordinator at Grain SA, who believes that this initiative will continue to assist vulnerable farmers in the coming months and years.

"Helping people aligns well with what Bayer does. We have seen first-hand how this project has helped so many households, and in turn so many communities, especially as so many of the farmers that we are helping are female from female-headed households," says Dudu Mashile, territory sales manager for smallholder and pre-commercial farmers at Bayer Crop Science. "When you empower women, you empower communities."

The immediate Covid-19 response through the "*Better*

Farms, Better Lives" initiative complements on-going smallholder support which will aid in mid-term recovery as well as long-term resilience. The success and impact of the initiative was captured over the past few months. First new soybean trait in SA in two decades

The South African regulatory authority approved the cultivation application submitted by Bayer for the Intacta® Roundup®Ready2 Pro on 29 July, 2021.

Intacta® Roundup®Ready2 Pro is only the second genetically modified (GM) soybean trait to be approved for cultivation in South Africa. The first one was Roundup® Ready soybean (GTS 40-3-2), which incidentally was approved on 1 August 2001 – almost two decades ago, to the day. The General Release (cultivation) approval follows more than five years of hard work and collaboration within the Bayer Crop Science Division across teams, functions, and regions.

The Intacta® Roundup®Ready2 Pro trait offers two built-in advantages. Firstly, it is aimed at providing soybean growers with insect protection from feeding damage caused by certain lepidopteran soybean pests such as *Helicoverpa armigera* (African bollworm). Secondly, it has glyphosate tolerance for weed management.

"This is a major milestone for Bayer Crop Science's business in South Africa and is anticipated to bring value to farmers and our business over many years. It is an important pillar for us in confirming our leadership in trait deregulation, but it is also a

great sign of collaboration with industry players," says Klaus Eckstein, CEO of Bayer Southern Africa and cluster head for Crop Science Africa.

The process is now underway to register and develop soybean varieties with Intacta® Roundup®Ready2 Pro for commercial production and



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distribution according to the regulations set out in the Plant Improvement (53 of 1976) and Plant Breeders' Rights (15 of 1976) Acts.

Limited commercial planting of new soybean varieties with the Intacta® Roundup®Ready2 Pro trait is expected by the 2022/2023 planting season pending the variety approvals as well as seed availability.

Although the country generally embraces modern agricultural advancements like biotechnology, the local soybean industry has seen little movement regarding the development and release of new traits. Over the past few years, a new soybean Breeding and Technology Fee as a value capture mechanism (generally referred to as the soybean levy), has boosted the industry's appetite for investing more resources into releasing new soybean cultivars and traits.

Bayer Crop Science in South Africa focused its attention on Intacta® Roundup®Ready2 Pro – a stacked trait technology (MON 87701 x MON 89788). The trait has been used successfully in Brazil for eight years and has proven its value to farmers in that country. The successful adoption of Intacta® Roundup®Ready2 Pro soybean technology is expected to increase economic and environmental benefits.

According to the South African Crop Estimates Committee, the production forecast for soybeans during the current 2020/2021 season stands at a record production of 1,918 million tonnes. The estimated area planted to soybeans is 827 100 ha and the average expected yield is 2,32 t/ha.

According to www.statista.com the soybean crop yield for 2020/2021 in Brazil was "forecast to reach 3,5 metric tons of oilseed per hectare of area planted", showing that country's competitiveness in the market.

Agri Wes-Kaap: Alexander Gibson

Die 32-jarige Alexander Gibson van Ceres in die Witzenberg Vallei is as die Agri Wes-Kaap Santam Landbou Jongboer van die Jaar aangewys. Gibson was een van vyf deelnemers wat vanjaar om die titel as beste jongboer in die Wes-Kaap meegeding het.

“Ek glo as jy vanaand hier sit as ’n deelnemer in die Wes-Kaap, in die Suid-Afrikaanse omgewing en demografie van landbou, dan het jy in elk geval klaar gewen,” het hy tydens sy aankondiging as wenner gesê. PF Theron, voorsitter van die Agri Wes-Kaap Jongboerkomitee, het gesê die paneel beoordelaars het weer dié jaar ’n baie moeilike taak gehad om ’n wenner uit uitstekende deelnemers te kies.

“Die kompetisie wys elke jaar vir ons dat die landbou se toekoms in goeie hande is, maar dit strek verder as net voedselsekerheid. Die bydrae wat die jongboere in hulle gemeenskappe maak en die waarde wat hulle toevoeg, is wat van ons jongboere ’n bate vir die land maak,” sê hy.



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Vrystaat Landbou: Douglas Osler

“Wat jy insit, sal jy uitkry.” Dit is een van Douglas Osler se oortuigings. Osler het die titel as Vrystaat Landbou Santam Landbou se Jongboer van die Jaar losgeslaan. Sy boerderyvertakkings sluit appelproduksie in.

“Harde werk, aandag aan detail en – in hierdie bedryf – baie geloof sal ’n besigheid laat aanhou groei en vooruitgaan,” sê hy. Volgens hom is uitdagings en terugslae leerkurwes wat bydra tot die spesiale ervaring van ’n ongelooflike beroep.

Verder is Osler passievvol oor mense-ontwikkeling en wil geleenthede vir werkers skep sodat hulle kan groei. “Ek wil werknemers hê wat trots is op ons handelsmerk, eienaarskap van hul verantwoordelikhede neem en ’n goeie bestaan maak.”

Hy sê jongboere het die unieke geleenthed om die nalatenskap van hul voorgangers voort te sit en daarop te bou deur tegnologie te omarm. Osler meen ook dat jongboere ’n rol het om te speel in die gesprek oor grondhervorming en dat hulle met nuwe idees sensitiewe sake kan oplos.



Agri Noordwes: Wernich Lemmer

As ’n gekwalifiseerde en professionele meganiese ingenieur het Wernich Lemmer as sisteemingenieur by die Matimba-kragstasie in Lephalale gewerk. Hy het dié beroepsveld in 2018 vaarwel geroep om voltyds in die familieboerdery betrokke te wees, en boer op die plaas Lemmersville.

Lemmer is aangewys as Agri Noordwes en Santam Landbou se Jongboer van die Jaar. Sy boerderyvertakkings bestaan uit 80% mielieproduksie en 20% beesproduksie en dit is sy visie om die boerdery verder generies uit te brei en om ook ’n derde kontantvloei-vertakking te begin. Laasgenoemde sal in geheel uiteindelik ’n suksesvolle maatskappy vorm.

Hy is van mening dat produsente in goeie jare, soos wat tans die geval is, ’n Josefsbeleid moet volg en reeds voorsiening maak vir uitdagende tye. “Die belangrikste is egter om as rentmeester nederig te bly en in jou geloof geanker te bly. As produsent is jou geloof jou belangrikste medewerker,” sê Lemmer.



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Mpumalanga Landbou: Kirch Muller

Kirch Muller is aangewys as Mpumalanga 2021 Toyota SA/Santam Agri Jongboer van die Jaar. Hy is die uitvoerende bestuurder van die Hoëveld-vertakking van Zonnebloem Boerdery in die Middelburg-distrik.

Muller is verantwoordelik vir die saaiery van bykans 6 000 ha, sowel as die veevertakking van ongeveer 1 000 beeste. Hy is reeds 12 jaar in diens van Zonnebloem Boerdery, waar hy as voorman begin werk het. Onder sy bestuur is presisieboerdery by Zonnebloem Boerdery gevestig en word dit steeds toegepas.




In memoriam

Dr. Piet Stassen, steenvrugten onderstamkenner, en mnr. Tippie Malgas van SAPO Trust.


